Pam likes to nap on Sam's pack.

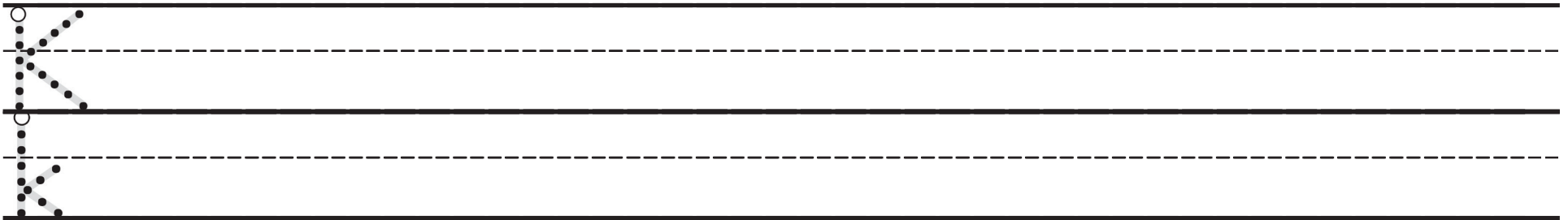
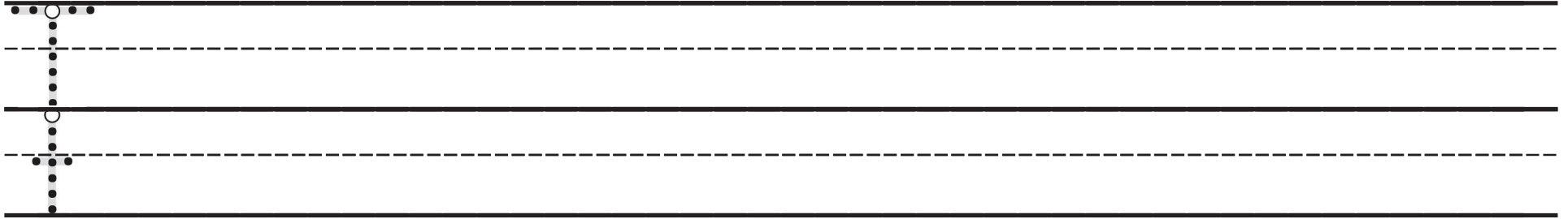
